
AUTUMN IN CADES COVE

A veteran of the War of 1812, Oliver arrived in the cove sometime prior to 1820 over an old Indian trail. The Olivers remained in the cove alone their first winter there and nearly starved to death. They survived on dried pumpkin that was given to them by friendly Cherokees in the vicinity.

I wanted to paint the cabin as it might have appeared when the Olivers made it their home. Antlers over the door, sunflowers drying under the porch, and a faithful hound dog waiting patiently for its master to step outside are just a few of my own inventions.
